Of particular use for teachers, this session will offer practical strategies to maximise the impact of mini whiteboards in lessons.

Dr. Richard Marsh, Director of Science, John Mason

Richard has been a teacher for 11 years, having started out at The Oxford Academy before moving to John Mason. He is an enthusiastic physics teacher, with a particular fondness of atoms, although he does find electrons a bit negative.

Safeguarding scenarios

A practical session for all student-facing colleagues wishing to think through safeguarding.

Cally Batcheldor, AHT, John Mason

Cally has been the Designated Safeguarding Lead at John Mason School for the past 8 years, and has a wealth of knowledge and experience in dealing with complex cases and working with multiagencies. She has been teaching Science, with a Chemistry specialism for over 20 years, and held several senior and middle leadership roles, including Head of Year, Director of Science, and Director of Pupil Premium.

Using phonics at transition KS2/3

With specific focus on phonics at transition from primary to secondary, this practical, discussion-based session will explore how we use phonics to support students to catch up, and how we might further improve this aspect of literacy teaching.

Siobhan Mansell, Teaching Assistant, Fitzharrys

Siobhan has taught phonics at secondary school for 15 years. She taught FFT and other phonic courses when she worked at John Mason and now delivers Fresh Start at Fitzharrys for Key Stage 3.

Using ALPS

This session is ideal for all those seeking to understand the data produced by ALPS, how to interact with it in a meaningful way, and how we might use it to shape our responses to students.

Julia Preston, Director of JMF6

Jules is Director of JMF6, the joint FHS & JMS sixth form. She currently teaches EPQ and media and examines AQA English.

Revision techniques: can we make learning stick?

In this session likely to appeal to secondary teachers in particular, we will explore how to build revision techniques into our practice to maximise learning and support independence.

Dr. Severine Ouvry, Science teacher and Deputy Head of KS4, Fitzharrys

Severine has been teaching science at secondary level for 5 years. In her role as deputy head of KS4, she has taken on the KS4 revision programme during tutor time and has gained some valuable insights on students' revision techniques and habits.

Maximising progress through assessment cycles

This session will explore the interrelationship between assessment and progress, and how best to design and utilise assessment to help students to improve.

Tim Smytheman, Head of Maths, Fitzharrys

Tim has taught Maths at secondary level for 13 years. Across a range of postholder roles, he has focused on diagnostic-progress cycles which help students recognise the consistent improvement they are making.

Deconstructing and teaching poems

For teachers of English, or those across the curriculum seeking to utilise poetry in their classrooms.

Imogen Adams, Teacher of English, John Mason

Imogen is an English teacher at John Mason. She is in her fourth year of teaching with a TLR for student engagement that facilitates academic reading beyond the Literature curriculum.

Speed date your leaders: teaching staff

In this session, aiming to explore career progression and pathways in teaching, leaders from across the Trust will speak briefly about their role, and their career pathway, with a chance to ask questions.
